



Its beautiful lines, strong rugged appearance and perfect balance made a strong appeal, attracting the attention of everyone who visited these great shows.

Recognizing that electric lighting offers the best illumination for night riding, we have selected what we consider the best lamps of this type. These lamps are made especially for the Indian, and are of graceful design. The headilight has a silver reflector, and is rated at nine can depreciate brilliant beam 500 feet shead. The tail lamp is of two candlepower, and throws a downward white light for illuminating the number plate. The lamps are finished in rich nickel, and the tail lamp bracket combines a license plate holder. The wiring is armored to insure immunity from short circuits in wet weather.

NEW RULES FOR WELLINGTON MEET

Flea Market

The 2013 flea market was the largest to date. It was the first year that we sold over 500 sites. We were almost sold out in spite of the rain and mud. In the future, if we get heavy rains like this year, we may have to limit the use of golf carts in the wetter areas. Next year, sites will still be \$25 for the weekend if your money is received at least one week prior to the start of the show. Returning vendors still need to get their money in by July 31st to keep the same spaces. Those wishing to move to other areas will be reassigned in the order their money is received with first choice being given to those who filled prime sites of vendors unable to attend who had paid for sites and then could not make it for justifiable reasons.

2014 Information

2014 reservations: Still \$25 for weekend if reserved by 9/12; 9/13 to 9/21 - sites \$20 per day. New vendors - register early space is limited aa a waiting list may be necessary this year. Electric for non-campers - \$15 for weekend. Flea Market vendors are not allowed to setup before 1:00pm Thursday. Changes for 2014: 1) Camping fee structure in the flea market will change just like camping in the campgrounds. Everyone will be paying \$40 for the weekend. 2) Now that we are almost full, we will be paying more attention to what new vendors are selling. Those selling show-related items will be given preference over those selling garage sale and household merchandise. 3) Vendors in high traffic area and in areas with electric will not be given more spaces. We will be trying to give vendors who have been waiting several years to move into these areas a chance to move. This allows for more diversity of items for sale in prime areas. 4) People selling crafts will be encouraged to set up in the Toy-Craft Building.

This includes mini bikes, garden tractors and any motorized vehicle. The police have been instructed to stop anyone under age. Parents who make no effort to heed police warnings may be asked not to return next year.


